

President's Message

CCA certainly is ready.

The association has been busy not only in conferences but also in initiating great collaborative work among associations, and promoting great work by our members and friends.

First of all, the reception between CCA and Shanghai Jiaotong University was a great success. More than 150 people showed up for the reception in Prague during the annual conference of ICA in May, 2018. CCA will carry on this new-found tradition in the

coming ICA conference in Washington D.C. This time, our partner is Tsinghua University, from which Dean Changfeng Chen and I have worked out a schedule. Rest assured, we will also have the CCA traditional dinner during ICA, where we can sit in comfort and catch up and exchange notes.

CCA is proud to be an initiator and we made possible the first Asia-Pacific Communication Alliance (APCA). As the current President of the Chinese Communication Association (2017-2019), I set up a task force in December 2017, consisted of past ICA and AEJMC presidents, colleague deans, directors and officers of communication associations to explore the idea of an alliance for various organizations in Asia-Pacific, to synthesize where Asia-Pacific communication has been, examine its current status, and to envision where it may lead. Members of the task force include the following: in no particular order.

Dr. Ang Peng Hwa is immediate Past President of ICA, from NTU in Singapore Dr. Eyung Jung Ki is President of KACA (Korean American Communication Association), and my colleague in Alabama

Dr. Akira Miyahara is ex-officio of Japan Communication Association, from Seinan Gakuin University. He was also the local organizer of ICA Fukuoka. Dr. Changfeng Chen is President of the Chinese Association for History of Journalism and Mass Communication (CAHJC). In other words, she leads all communication associations in China. She is also Dean of Journalism & Communication at Tsinghua University.

Dr. Prabu David is Dean of College of Communication Arts and Sciences at Michigan State University.

Dr. Yu-li Li is Dean of Research & Development, National Chengchi University in Taiwan. She is also a former CCA President.

Dr. Guo-Ming Chen is the founder and former President of ACCS (The Association for Chinese Communication Studies), from the University of Rhode Island

Dr. Bu Zhong is Past President of CCA, from Penn State University Dr. Jack Qiu is Vice-President of CCA, from the Chinese University of Hong Kong.

Dr. Deb Aikat, with the South Asia Communication association, from UNC-Chapel Hill School of Media and Journalism

Dr. Kyu-Ho Youm is past President of AEMC, and Jonathan Marshall First Amendment Chair

Dr. Terry Flew is President-Elect-Select of ICA, and Professor at Queensland University of Technology.

Dr. Sung Kyum Cho, Director of the Center for Asian Public Opinion Research and Cooperative Initiatives, from Chungnam University

Dr. Shuhua Zhou, President of CCA, and Leonard H. Goldenson Endowed chair from the Missouri School of Journalism

These efforts were paying off as the alliance formally declared its founding at Tsinghua University, Beijing, P. R. China on October 25th, 2018. Thirty-three enthusiastic representatives from sixteen organizations from the US, China, India, Japan, South Korea, Sri Lanka, Indonesia, Thailand, New Zealand, Australia, Singapore, Taiwan, the Philippines, India, Hong Kong and Malaysia took part in the meeting. Dr. Changfeng Chan of CCHJC (The Chinese Association for History of Journalism & Communication) was elected President of APCA. Tsinghua was instrumental in funding the first conference. I was elected Vice President of APCA, along with two other vice presidents, Dr. Eyun Jung Ki of KACA (Korean American Communication Association), and Dr. Jantima Kheokao of ANPOR (Asian Network for Public Opinion Research). Terry Flew, incoming ICA President, was appointed as Chair of APCA's Academic Advisory Committee. APCA plans to promote best practices in journalism and communication studies, provide training, and encourage cooperation between communication and journalism associations in the Asia-Pacific region. At this moment, Dr. Chan is having Tsinghua working on the APCA website, Dr. Cho and CCA Vice President Jack Qiu are working on the APCA constitution and a survey. Former CCA president, Dr. Zhong Bu is writing an editorial for APCA in his capacity as senior editor of Computers in Human Behaviors.

I have also been working to get CCA into BEA (Broadcast Education Association), and conversely, get BEA more diversified and internationalized. This bridging work resulted in, among other projects, a training workshop on October 27th, 2019 in Hangzhou, P. R. China, on "Visual Power: Language, Storytelling, and Research" by me and five members of the BEA brass, Greg Luft, Michael Bruce, Tony Demars, Vic Costello, and Heather Birks. More than 120 faculty and students from the Chinese Television and New Media Association attended the workshop. This year, CCA will also have a panel at BEA with panel that gathers seasoned researchers and educators to discuss cutting-edge research and teaching related to Chinese issues and Chinese communication, from documenting revolution, communicating the trade war, social media analytics, algorithmic audience, to phenomena such as esports and depression discussions in new media. These panelists include Dr. Zhou He from City University of Hong Kong, Roselyn Du from Hong Kong Baptist University, Dr. Louisa Ha, Editor of JMCQ and Professor from Bowling State University, Professor Tang Tang from Kent State University, Professor Nan Yu from University of Central Florida and her coauthors Shuya Pan and Huang Yao from Renmin University, Professor Bu Zhong from Penn State University, and Yakun Huang from Jinan University, as well as Professor Xue Ke from Shanghai Jiatong University. There is another panel to feature our Chinese colleagues from the Television and New Media association.

Our other efforts are thriving as well. We have a record number of lifetime members, thanks to our recruitment efforts by the membership committee led by Dr. Yong Volz and our dedicated coordinators in different parts of the world, especially Dr. Jinghong Xu at Beijing Normal University. Dr. Lu Tang does her work quietly but efficiently as treasurer of CCA, taking care of our membership in various organizations, and sending out receipts promptly to new and renewed members. Dr. Cong Li led a very successful webinar on collaboration.

CCA wants to be your association and wants to be a venue to facilitate, coordinate, and help our members in our studies and careers. If we can do anything to promote research and teaching and our general wellbeing, please don't hesitate to suggest ideas, lend a helping hand, take part in worthwhile pursuits.

In March, it is time to elect our new vice president/president elect. Jack and I welcome nomination. And we will run the election to find our next colleague to continue the good work of CCA.

Another fantastic line of development is APCA, Asia-Pacific Communication Alliance, which CCA helped co-found in October 2018 during the first APCA meeting hosted by Tsinghua University School o f Journalism Communication. o encourage more exchanges of ideas and experiences among Chinese scholars and students, CCA has been collaborating with ASSC (Association for Chinese Communication Studies) on co-hosting academic webinars on WeChat, covering various topics such as conducting health communication research and performing academic services. The most recent webinar, focusing on international collaborations, was held on August 4th and 6th. This webinar adopted a new format. Instead of having all panelists share their thoughts and opinions with the audience at the same time in a single session, it was broken into two halves. The first half was held on August 4th, and the discussion was in Chinese. The two panelists were Dr. Connie Yuan at Cornell University and Dr. Xiaohua Wang at Shenzhen University. The second half was held on August 6th, and it was in English. The speaker was Dr. Patrice Buzzanell at the University of South Florida. Each half lasted for 45 minutes.

Best Faculty Article Award

The award will be conferred during the annual conference of International Communication Association in Washington DC, May 2019.

HOW TO NOMINATE:

Nomination can be made either by the author(s) or other scholars.

The nomination package should be submitted in a single PDF document in English and includes:

- Contact information of the author and/or the nominator, including name, phone number, and email address;
- An article published in English in a peer-reviewed journal between January 1 and December 31, 2017;
- Two nomination letters that address the significance and the creativity of the article and how it contributes to communication; and
- The author's CV.

The nomination must be submitted electronically to Dr. WenjingXie at wjjwxie@gmail.com by 11:59pm EST on March 30, 2019. Please use "Nomination for CCA Best Faculty Article Award" as the email subject line.

he Chinese Communication Association (CCA) invites nominations for the Outstanding Dissertation Award. Dissertation completed in English and defended between January 1, 2017 and December 31, 2018 is eligible for consideration. The dissertation should advance Chinese communication research. The award will be presented during the annual conference of International Communication Association in Washington DC, May 2019. The candidate should be a CCA member when accepting the award.

HOW TO NOMINATE:

The dissertation can be nominated by the author or the dissertation advisor. The nomination package should be submitted in a single PDF document in English and includes:

- Contact information of the author and/or the nominator, including name, phone number, and email address;
- * A letter of support from the dissertation advisor, which should address the significance of the dissertation and why it deserves the award;
- * A 5-page abstract of the dissertation;
- ◆ The complete dissertation.

HOW TO NOMINATE:

The student candidate can be nominated by his/her advisor or another faculty member at the university. The nomination package should be submitted in a single PDF document in English and includes:

- Contact information of the student and/or the nominator, including name, phone number, and email address;
- A list of all courses taught as instructor of record during the student's MA and/or Ph.D. studies;
- Teaching evaluations of the courses that the nominee taught as instructor of record between January 1 and December 31, 2018;
- The nominee's teaching philosophy, up to two pages maximum;
- A letter of support from the advisor or another faculty member at the university, which should address why the student deserves the award.

- ◆ A 1-page personal statement by the candidate illustrating the services that the candidate has provided to the CCA community, including serving the membership at large, serving the Chinese communication scholar community, active contribution and participation in CCA activities, etc.;
- ◆ One nomination letter that addresses the candidate's services and contributions as listed above; and
- ♦ The candidate's CV.
